

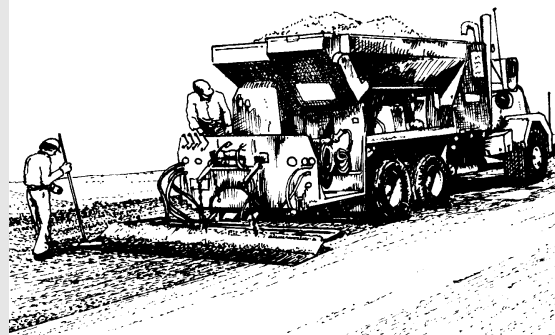

Mr. Smith holds a BS degree in Civil Engineering from the Michigan Technological University and was formerly the Western Regional Managing Director for the Asphalt Institute. Before joining the Asphalt Institute in 1986, he was a senior engineer in the Asphalt Pavement section of the Caltrans Transportation Laboratory in Sacramento.

What You Will Learn: Participants in this four-hour workshop will learn the basic concepts and strategies for maintaining asphalt pavement and the value of using proper maintenance efforts. The class focuses on pavement terminology, maintenance options, proper asphalt materials and equipment, and safety. Attend this workshop to learn techniques for extending the service life of asphalt pavements through proper maintenance and repair procedures.

Who Should Attend: The workshop is tailored for street maintenance workers and supervisors as well as paving inspectors in public agencies. Pavement managers and specification writers could also benefit.
